ROCH: Pi day – bake from the library collection, had 19 bakers, winner got free night stay and breakfast at Royal Park Hotel; author Steve Berry ; spring break this week = STEM week; 3D print your own phone case; local history room becoming maker space; local history collection will move to closed stacks; craft programs include bookfolding, zen garden program, make your own plant markers using forks & metal stamping kit; in conjunction with Rochester Bicentennial the summer reading theme is Happy Birthday Rochester, Help us build the next 200 years; Everyone's Reading; Historical Society conducting biking tour; nerf programs; adult recess on July 14 w/bounce house, virtual reality escape room, nerf games & cash bar; new piano in program room; popular concert series
